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What the *Grapevine* Data are Intended to Mean

This report details state tax appropriations for the support of higher education in fiscal year (FY) 2004. The data were collected from June 2003 through December 2003 in the annual *Grapevine* survey conducted by Illinois State University's Center for the Study of Education Policy. The states were asked to adhere to five general guidelines when reporting their appropriations data:

- 1. Report only appropriations, not actual expenditures.
- 2. Report only sums appropriated for annual operating expenses.
- 3. For state tax appropriations in complex universities, set out separately the sums appropriated for (or allocated to) the main campuses, branch campuses and medical centers (even if on the main campus). The medical center item should include operation of colleges of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy and nursing, and teaching hospitals, either lumped as one sum or set out separately as preferred.

4. Include:

- Sums appropriated for state aid to local public community colleges and for the operation of statesupported community colleges, and for vocational-technical two-year colleges or institutes that are predominantly for high school graduates and adult students.
- Sums appropriated to statewide coordinating boards or governing boards, either for board expenses or for allocation by the board to other institutions or both.
- Sums appropriated for state scholarships or other student financial aid.
- Sums destined for higher education but appropriated to some other state agency. Sometimes these sums have to be estimated because the exact amount disbursed cannot be known until after the end of the fiscal period. Examples include
 - -- funds intended for faculty fringe benefits and that may be appropriated to the state treasurer and disbursed by that office; and
 - -- certain funds for medical and health education that may be appropriated to the state department of health and disbursed from that department.
- Appropriations directed to private institutions of higher education at all levels.
- 5. Exclude appropriations for capital outlays and debt service as well as appropriations of sums derived from federal sources, student fees, auxiliary enterprises and other non-tax sources.

These ground rules are meant to achieve a level of uniform reporting. However, the diverse practices of the 50 states make it impossible to eliminate all inconsistencies and accomplish absolute comparability among states and institutions. Comparative analyses should be conducted with this limitation in mind.

Summary Findings from the Grapevine Survey of the States, Fiscal Year 2004

The *Grapevine* project, begun in 1958 by M. M. Chambers, entails an annual survey of state higher education and government officials. The intent is to record annual tax appropriations for the operating expenses of higher education, noting percent changes from year to year. As such, the *Grapevine* data are indicators of state tax effort in support of higher education. ¹


Survey results for fiscal year 2004 (FY04) reveal that, in aggregate, state tax appropriations for higher education declined by 2.1% from FY03 to FY04. This is only the third one-year decrease registered in the history of the *Grapevine* project (the others were for FY92 and FY93), and it is the steepest decline to date (see Table 1). In all, 23 states reported decreases from FY03 to FY04 (see Figure 1, next page). Of the remaining states, only 10 registered increases of 2.5% or above. In contrast, only 13 states experienced declines between FY02 and FY03, and 3 experienced declines from FY01 to FY02.

This negative trend in the wake of the recent recession reflects higher education's vulnerability to economic downturns. As was the case a decade ago, there is a lag between the end of a recession and the capacity of states to increase support for colleges and universities. But in contrast to the early 1990s, fiscal problems are now more widely spread across the states. Most of the -0.9% decrease registered between FY92 and FY93 was accounted for by a 14% decline in California's tax appropriations; only 17 other states experienced declines between FY92 and FY93, and those declines ranged from -4% to -1%. Between FY03 and FY04, California experienced a 5.9% decline, and declines in 22 other states ranged from -19.3% in Massachusetts to -0.1% in North Carolina.

The national tables provided on pages 4 through 13 offer more a more detailed picture of the FY04 *Grapevine* survey. Summary observations include the following:

STATE HIGHER EDUCATION TAX APPROPRIATIONS, FY 2004 – Page 1

¹ State "tax effort" supporting higher education should not be confused with "state spending" for higher education. The *Grapevine* data exclude state allocations to higher education that derive from lotteries, tobacco settlements, student tuition payments, interest income and other non-tax sources.



- Across the states, the percent change in state tax appropriations for higher education ranged from -19.3% in Massachusetts to +30.2% in Nevada. (See Table 2 on page 5.)
- Much of the decline nationwide from FY03 to FY04 can be attributed to decreases experienced in 7 of the 9 "megastates". California, which experienced a 5.9% decline; New York, which experienced a 4.5% decline; Florida, which experienced a 2.8% decline; Michigan, which experienced a 3.3% decline; Pennsylvania, which experienced a 3.2% decline; Illinois, which experienced a 2.2% decline; and North Carolina, which experienced a 0.1% decline. These seven states accounted for 69% of the total decrease in state tax appropriations experienced nationwide between FY03 and FY04. (See Table 3 on page 6.)
- The higher education systems in over half of the states (29) began FY04 with state tax appropriations that are less than the tax monies allocated by the states two years previously (FY02). Across the states, the percent change from FY02 to FY04 ranged from -23.0% in Massachusetts to +39.2% in Nevada. (See Table 4 on page 7.) In 5 states—Colorado, Iowa, Massachusetts, Missouri, South Carolina, and West Virginia—FY04 appropriations were less than appropriations received five years ago in FY99. (See Table 6 on page 9.)

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² This term refers to the nine states that collectively account for over 50% of all state tax appropriations supporting higher education: California, Florida, Illinois, Michigan, New York, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, and Texas.

- States vary greatly in terms of FY04 higher education appropriations per capita, ranging from \$392.89 per capita in Wyoming to \$87.39 in New Hampshire. They also vary in terms of appropriations per \$1,000 in personal income, ranging from \$13.99 in New Mexico to \$2.53 in New Hampshire. (See Table 8 on page 11.)
- Prior to FY02, median higher education appropriations per capita had been tracking upwards while the median appropriations per \$1,000 had been declining. This suggested a decrease in the proportion of the states' wealth that is devoted to higher education, even as the dollar amount spent on higher education increased. However, both the median appropriations per capita and the median appropriations per \$1,000 in personal income declined from FY02 to FY 03 and from FY03 to FY04. (See Table 10 on page 13.)
- In 35 states, percent changes from FY03 to FY04 in higher education tax allocations were less than the percent changes in total general fund revenues available to the states. In 33 states, percent changes from FY03 to FY04 in higher education tax allocations were less than the percent changes in total expenditures. This may suggest higher education's vulnerability as a discretionary item in state budgets. (See Table 9 on page 12.)

Individual state tables, listed on pages 14 to 83, offer detailed information on the change from FY03 to FY04 in each state's tax appropriation for the support of higher education. In several instances, these declines from FY03 to FY04 follow downward revisions to the FY03 data initially reported last year. For example, revised FY03 appropriations for CA, CO, MD, MI, MN, OK, SC, and VA were—in each state—at least 5% lower than initial FY03 appropriations reported in last year's *Grapevine* survey. We cannot always tell if these revisions represent genuine rescissions as opposed to budget adjustments made necessary by such things as insurance premium increases. But the relatively large percentage difference between the initial and the revised figures in these states suggests the former rather than the latter.

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³ Each year, we ask states to report revisions to data they provided in the previous year's survey. We cannot always tell if these revisions represent genuine rescissions as opposed to budget adjustments made necessary by such things as insurance premium increases. Nonetheless, the number of states (34) reporting downward revisions to FY03 appropriations is relatively high. At the height of the recession of the early 1990s, the number of states reporting downward revisions to their FY92 data was only 19.
