GRAPEVINE COMPILATION OF STATE HIGHER EDUCATION TAX APPROPRIATIONS DATA FOR FISCAL YEAR 2007

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January 2007

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Introduction: What the Data are Intended to Mean

The *Grapevine* project, begun in 1960 by M. M. Chambers, entails an annual survey of state higher education and government officials. The intent is to record annual state tax appropriations for the operating expenses of higher education, noting percent changes from year to year. As such, the *Grapevine* data are indicators of state tax effort in support of higher education and should not be confused with total state spending for higher education. We ask states not to include allocations to higher education that derive from non-tax sources. Results are posted on a series of data tables at http://www.grapevine.ilstu.edu/.

This report summarizes major findings for Fiscal Year 2007 (FY07). The data reported here were collected from April 2006 through November 2006 in the annual *Grapevine* survey conducted by Illinois State University's Center for the Study of Education Policy. States were asked to provide data for the new fiscal year (FY07) and revisions (if necessary) to data reported in previous surveys for FY06, FY05, FY02 and FY97. This allows us to determine changes in appropriations over one-year, two-year, five-year, and ten-year time periods. ¹

Respondents were asked to adhere to five general guidelines when reporting their appropriations data:

- 1. Report only appropriations, not actual expenditures.
- 2. Report only sums appropriated for annual operating expenses.
- 3. For state tax appropriations in complex universities, set out separately the sums appropriated for (or allocated to) the main campuses, branch campuses and medical centers (even if on the main campus). The medical center item should include operation of colleges of medicine, dentistry, pharmacy and nursing, and teaching hospitals, either lumped as one sum or set out separately as preferred.

4. Include:

• Sums appropriated for state aid to local public community colleges and for the operation of state-supported community colleges, and for vocational-technical two-year colleges or institutes that are predominantly for high school graduates and adult students.

- Sums appropriated to statewide coordinating boards or governing boards, either for board expenses or for allocation by the board to other institutions or both.
- Sums appropriated for state scholarships or other student financial aid.
- Sums destined for higher education but appropriated to some other state agency. Sometimes these sums have to be estimated because the exact amount disbursed cannot be known until after the end of the fiscal period. Examples include
 - -- funds intended for faculty fringe benefits and that may be appropriated to the state treasurer and disbursed by that office; and

- -- certain funds for medical and health education that may be appropriated to the state department of health and disbursed from that department.
- Appropriations directed to private institutions of higher education at all levels.
- 5. Exclude appropriations for capital outlays and debt service as well as appropriations of sums derived from federal sources, student fees, auxiliary enterprises and other non-tax sources.

These ground rules are meant to achieve a level of uniform reporting. However, the diverse practices and budgeting cycles of the 50 states make it impossible to eliminate all inconsistencies and accomplish absolute comparability among states and institutions. Comparative analyses should be conducted with these caveats in mind.

Summary Findings, Fiscal Year 2007

Grapevine survey results for fiscal year 2007 (FY07) reveal that state tax appropriations for higher education totaled to approximately \$72.18 billion, a 7.1% increase from the \$67.4 billion appropriated in Fiscal Year 2005-06 (FY06). Year-to-year changes in appropriations have continued to increase since the 2.1% downturn from FY03 to FY04 (Table 1). This year's increase is the largest since fiscal year 2000, when appropriations

for higher education also rose by 7.1%, a high point reached just before the 2001 recession ushered in a period of limited growth in state support for higher education and—for many states—a period of substantial declines.




Figure 1: Percent Change in State Tax Appropriations for Higher Education, From FY06 to FY07, by State

The overall upturn this year follows in the wake of the relatively strong revenue growth experienced by many states in FY06, allowing them to increase "spending on programs that experienced significant budget cuts in the most recent fiscal crisis." This enhanced fiscal situation can be seen in a comparison of this year's *Grapevine* findings with the results from last year. While only three states increased tax support for higher education by 10% or more last year (from FY05 to FY06), 14 states experienced gains of 10% or more from FY06 to FY07 (see Figure 1 and Table 2, below). This is the largest number of states to report double-digit gains over the past 16 years. The second highest was in FY00, when nine states registered gains of 10% or greater.

However, detailed findings summarized in Tables 2-8 (pp. 8-25 below), show that that many areas of the country are still experiencing only anemic growth in state tax support for higher education. The following paragraphs draw on those tables to highlight key results from the FY07 survey in terms of state-by-state variations in the percent change in appropriations over time, regional variations in funding over time, appropriations in the nine

State-by-State Findings

Figure 1 (above) and Table 2 (below, pp. 8-10) compare FY07 appropriations for higher education with appropriations for earlier years, showing variations across the states in terms of the percent change in tax support over time. Data for the one-year percent change (from FY06 to FY07) reveal that Alabama experienced the largest percent gain (18.7%), reflecting that state's relatively strong economic growth. At the other end was New Jersey, which experienced a 2.7% decline in tax appropriations for higher education in a state budget that emerged only after a standoff between the governor and the legislature led to a 7-day government shutdown. Across the states, Georgia and New Hampshire fell at the midpoint, each reporting a 5.8% increase from FY06 to FY07; the percent changes for the remaining states were either above or below this figure.

Nationwide, the two-year percent change from FY05 to FY07 was 14.4%. Alabama registered the highest increase over the two-year period (37.5%) while Missouri experienced the smallest increase (2.0%). Half of the states reported two-year percent changes of 12% or more, while half reported increases of less than 12%. This

is the first year since FY01 in which no state reported tax appropriations that were lower than the total monies appropriated two years previously.

Data on longer-term changes from FY02 to FY07 show that despite the overall gains registered over the past two years, the states have had varying success in returning to the levels of funding experienced before the downturn triggered by the 2001 recession. Nationwide, the five-year percent gain from FY02 to FY07 was 15.1%, not much higher than the 14.4% increase from FY05 to FY07. Half of the states experienced gains of 13% or more from FY02 to FY07 while half reported that the percent change over this time period was less than 13%. Appropriations in FY07 were actually lower than FY02 appropriations in 7 states: Colorado (-10.1%), Illinois (-3.9%), Massachusetts (-2.1%), Michigan (-8.1%), Missouri (-9.9%), West Virginia (-1.2%), and Wisconsin (-1.5%). Four additional states experienced gains of less than 5% over the same time period: Iowa (2.2%), Minnesota (1.5%), Ohio (4.4%), and South Carolina (2.9%).

Regional Variations

Further evidence of the varied results across the nation can be seen in Table 3 (pp. 11-13), which details tax appropriations totals in the eight regions used by the Bureau of Economic Analysis in many of its reports. The table highlights the relatively anemic growth of state tax support for higher education in the Midwest and Northeast. States in the Plains and Great Lakes regions experienced the smallest gains from FY06 to FY07 (3.2% and 3.7%, respectively), while gains in the New England states were not much larger (4.6%). On the other extreme were states in the Southeast, which collectively experienced a gain of 10.2%. In between were the states in the Mideast region (7.2%), the Rocky Mountain region (7.0%), the Southwest region (6.7%), and the Far West region (6.6%).

The "Megastates"

A ranking of the states by the dollar amount of FY07 appropriations shows that 9 states accounted for just over half (51.8%) of the national total (Table 4, pp. 14-16). California is the largest of these "megastates," appropriating \$10.84 billion for higher education, 15% of all state tax monies appropriated for higher education in FY07. The remaining 8 states are (in order of the total dollar amount appropriated) Texas (7.6% of total appropriations nationwide), New York (6.7% of total appropriations nationwide), Florida (4.9% of total appropriations nationwide), North Carolina (4.7% of total appropriations nationwide), Illinois (3.9% of total appropriations nationwide), Ohio (3.0% of total appropriations nationwide), and Pennsylvania (3.0% of total appropriations nationwide).

This is the first *Grapevine* report to list Georgia as a megastate, displacing Michigan from the megastate column. Georgia's new status as a megastate is the result of the inclusion (beginning in 2003) of the state's technical colleges in the Georgia *Grapevine* report. Their inclusion reflects the changed status of these institutions after 2000, when legislation designated them as "colleges" and when they began offering associate's degrees. (See Breeden, K.H. Overall, tax appropriations for higher education in the megastates rose from FY06 to FY07 by 7.1%, matching the national figure. However, the percent changes for these nine states varied considerably. North Carolina and New York experienced relatively high increases of 13.9% and 10.8%, respectively. The remaining megastates registered increases that were below the 7.1% national figure: Florida (6.9%), California (6.9%), Georgia (5.8%), Illinois (5.7%), Pennsylvania (5.2%), Texas (4.1%), and Ohio (3.0%).

Appropriations for Community Colleges

State tax appropriations for community colleges, based on data from 46 of the 50 states, ¹⁰ rose overall by 6.2% from FY06 to FY07, lower than the 7.1% national increase for higher education generally. Appropriations received by "state-aided community colleges," those for which local tax monies constitute a significant portion of institutional revenue, rose by only 5.3% (Table 5, pp. 17-18), while appropriations for "state community colleges", those which receive little or no local tax monies, increased by a significantly higher rate of 8.2% (Table 6, pp. 19-20). Thus it appears that community colleges which have little or no access to local tax monies tended to receive a greater proportional increase in state tax support from FY06 to FY07 than did community colleges at which local tax monies constitute a major revenue source.

Appropriations per Capita and per \$1,000 in Personal Income

Tables 7 and 8 (pp. 21-25) draw on data from the Bureau of the Census and the Bureau of Economic Analysis to detail state tax appropriations per capita and per \$1,000 in personal income. Per capita appropriations for higher education in FY07 varied greatly across the states, ranging from \$94.28 in New Hampshire to \$503.13 in Wyoming (Table 8, pp. 23-25). Virginia fell at the mid-point, with a per-capita appropriation of \$242.94. Nationwide, per capita state tax appropriations for higher education rose by 6.0% from FY06 to FY07, less than the overall 7.1% increase in the total amount appropriated. Three states experienced declines in per-capita appropriations from FY06 to FY07—New Jersey (-3.0%), Montana (-1.7%), and North Dakota (-0.2%). The remaining states registered increases ranging from 1.1% in Utah to 20.1% in Louisiana.

FY07 appropriations per \$1,000 in personal income also varied greatly across the states, ranging from \$2.40 in New Hampshire to \$13.69 in New Mexico (Table 7, pp. 21-22). Texas was at the mid-point, appropriating \$6.83 per \$1,000 in personal income. The percent change from FY06 to FY07 nationwide was only 0.7%, far below the 6.0% change in per-capita appropriations and the 7.1% change in the total dollar amount appropriated. Half of the states experienced declines from FY06 to FY07 in appropriations per \$1,000 in personal income ranging from -8.8% in New Jersey to -0.3% in Vermont. Another 24 states registered increases that ranged from 0.1% in Michigan to 11.1% in Alabama, while one state (Pennsylvania) registered no change at all. Thus, in at least half of the states, increases in state tax monies appropriated for higher education have not kept pace with economic growth as measured by increases in personal income.

State Tables, Fiscal Year 2007

The following pages provide appropriations reports for each of the 50 states. Each lists FY06 appropriations and FY07 appropriations. Revisions, if any, to FY06 appropriations initially reported last year are also noted. In addition, many states provide explanatory footnotes.

The level of detail in the reports varies from state to state. Some list appropriations data for individual institutions, while others offer only aggregate figures for state higher education systems. Some provide separate lines for monies that are destined for higher education but that are initially appropriated to other agencies (as in the case of fringe benefit monies that are originally appropriated to the state treasurer). But others fold those figures into lines for institutions or state systems. Appropriations for student financial aid are reported separately by most states, but in some cases they are folded into lines for state higher education institutions or agencies.

The diverse practices and budgeting cycles of the 50 states make it impossible to eliminate all inconsistencies and accomplish absolute comparability among states and institutions. Comparative analyses should be conducted with these caveats in mind.
