WHAT? The ASSESSMENT OF PROFESSIONAL TEACHING (APT)

Will assess candidates on the Illinois Professional Teaching Standards and the language arts and technology standards for all teachers.

WHO must take the test?

- ➔ Candidates completing approved teacher preparation programs in the state of Illinois whose applications for certification are received on or after October 1, 2003.
 - Includes individuals who complete programs before October 1, 2003, but whose *applications are received after* October 1, 2003.
- ➔ Candidates who hold Illinois certificates and seek a new certificate--*which covers a different grade range than the certificate held--and* whose application for certification is received on or after October 1, 2003.

For example:

 - An individual who holds an Elementary K-9 certificate and applies for a Secondary 6-12 certificate on or after October 1, 2003, *will* be required to take the APT-Secondary or the APT-Special because the certificate held does not cover the grade range of the new certificate.
 - An individual who holds a Special K-12 certificate and applies for an Elementary certificate on or after October 1, 2003 *will not* be required to take the APT because the certificate held does cover the grade range of the new certificate.
- ➔ All candidates from out-of-state making application for their first Illinois early childhood, elementary, secondary or special certificate on or after October 1, 2003.

WHICH version of the APT? There are 4 versions of the test: Early Childhood, Elementary, Secondary, & Special. The type of certificate sought determines which version of the test is required.

Certificate Sought	Level of APT Required
Early Childhood (Birth to Grade 3)	APT-Early Childhood
Elementary (K-9)	APT-Elementary <i>or</i> APT-Special
Secondary (6-12)	APT-Secondary <i>or</i> APT-Special
Special (K-12) or (P-21)	APT-Special

Note: The APT requirement is in addition to the requirement for passing the basic skills and subject-matter knowledge tests.
